



REGIONAL LABOR MARKET TRENDS





- The active population of the Centru Region decreased by 5.7% between 2005 and 2022, reaching 1,025,000 people in 2022.
- Occupancy rate of the population aged 15-64 increased from 55.8% in 2005 to 61% in 2023
- The number of employees increased by 19 % between 2005 and 2024, reaching 719 thousand employees in January 2024
- Labor productivity at regional level, expressed in purchasing power parity/person employed/year, reached over 70% of the EU27 average in 2023.
- The average monthly net salary, in euros, increased almost 5 times between 2005 and 2024, reaching 1050 euros in January 2025.

KEY DATA ON AGRICULTURE IN CENTRU REGION

- Agricultural area: 1.9 million hectares, representing 55.7% of the total area of the region and 13% of Romania's agricultural area
- Agriculture and forestry account for 8.9% of the total employed population in Centru Region, this share being below the share recorded at national level (11%).
- Regional agriculture has a significant technical and material base: 16.8 % of the country's tractor fleet, 14.8% of all tractor plows, 17.3% of mechanical cultivators and 38.6% of potato harvesters.
- of regional agricultural production: 12.2 billion lion (in 2022), representing 11.1% of the value of national production
- Agriculture and forestry account for 5.4% of the total regional GVA, close to the rate recorded at national level (5.3%).

PROTECTED GEOGRAPHICAL INDICATION: Originating product from a certain place, region or country; a certain quality, reputation or another characteristic can be attributed mainly of origin geographical location of the product and he little one from the production stages are taking place in the geographical area delimited.


